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# LEADERSHIP SANTA ROSA CLASS 42

## PROGRAM DESCRIPTION & SELECTION CRITERIA

Leadership Santa Rosa is an educational program that provides participants with what many call a “Master’s Degree in Sonoma County.” The following information is intended to give you an overview of the LSR program and to help you prepare for the application process.

### PURPOSE AND DESCRIPTION

The purpose of the Leadership Santa Rosa program is to identify, develop, and equip effective community leaders who will help create and support a spirit of cooperation for the resolution of future community challenges. The program is designed to meet these challenges through a two-year series of experiences, including retreats, ten full-day sessions with community “movers & shakers,” and planning the topic-day sessions for the next class. Exposure to pertinent issues, broad thinkers, and the richness of Sonoma County is intended to:

- Educate future leaders about a broad range of current community needs and concerns.
- Encourage informed individuals to serve in leadership roles benefiting the community.
- Enhance community leadership, communication, and management skills.
- Develop leadership skills by planning the LSR experience for the following year’s class.

The Leadership Santa Rosa class will include participants from business, government, and community service organizations.

### SELECTION CRITERIA

Selection of candidates for the LSR Class 42 program will be judged on the following criteria:

- Complete and detailed answers provided on the written application.
- The post-application interview.
- Demonstrated active participation and leadership in professional and/or community organizations.
- Current active employment or clearly demonstrated active community involvement.
- A strong personal desire for community involvement.
- Ability to commit to the first-year, ten-month Leadership schedule of retreats and monthly sessions.
- Commitment to plan and attend two or more days for LSR Class 43 during 2026-2027.
- Ability to commit to attend two year-two leadership sessions during 2027.

In summary, ideal candidates will be selected on how they have demonstrated active personal involvement in community affairs and have taken personal responsibility and initiative in addressing one or more specific community needs. Such individuals may be emerging or established leaders in any arena. The experiences of these individuals are in contrast to passive, dues-paying membership in organizations. The objective of the program is to enhance the ability of these individuals to serve their community by increasing both their knowledge base and their contacts list.

**SELECTION FOR LEADERSHIP SANTA ROSA IS A TWO-STEP PROCESS:** Following the application deadline, applications are reviewed, and if selected, applicants will be invited to an interview conducted the weeks of September 29 & October 6. Final selection will be based on the information furnished by you on the application and in the 20 minute interview. Both are considered in determining final selection.

**NOTE:** Because of the program’s commitment to creating a diverse mix of participants and the limited class size (30-35), it may not be possible to interview all applicants. We encourage past applicants to apply again.

The application period opens on August 26, 2025 and closes on September 15, 2025. All applicants will be notified of their status by October 31, 2025.

## TUITION, SCHOLARSHIPS & APPLYING FOR LSR

### TUITION

Tuition for Chamber members is \$2,900; non-member tuition is \$3,650. Tuition is due by December 2, 2025. An employer, other sponsor, or the participant may pay the tuition. Tuition will not be refunded if the selected applicant is unable, for any reason, to complete the year. Cost includes all expenses for the beginning retreat, monthly program expenses, year-end retreat, year-two program days, and graduation.

### SCHOLARSHIP REQUEST

Each year, the Leadership Santa Rosa Alumni Association (an independent 501c3 nonprofit organization) makes a limited amount of funds available to Leadership Santa Rosa participants in need of tuition assistance. Applicants may apply for tuition assistance by submitting a Request for Scholarship Consideration form when completing the program application. All scholarship request forms will be reviewed and considered by the LSR Alumni Association.

Scholarship award amounts are based on the number of requests received by, and funds available from, the LSR Alumni Association. The maximum scholarship amount is \$775.

A criterion for scholarship is a demonstrated financial hardship that would prevent a selected candidate from participating in the program. Candidates employed by large, private-sector companies are typically not eligible for assistance. Candidates who are employed in the nonprofit, public sector, or are self-employed are given priority for tuition assistance.

Application for tuition assistance is not considered in the selection process and is confidential. Acceptance into the program does not mean a scholarship has been awarded. Scholarship applicants will be notified of the status of their request by November 7, 2025.

- Year-end retreat held on October 29, 2026.

### YEAR 2 COMMITMENTS INCLUDE MANDATORY ATTENDANCE AT:

- Planning sessions for, and attendance at, two or more full program days for LSR Class 43.
  - Must assist in planning at least two program days
  - Must attend at least 80% of the planning committee meetings (could include Zoom opportunities)
  - Must attend at least 50% of each day planned.
- Attendance at two year-two leadership sessions.
- Graduation on November 4, 2027.



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
